# 2. The Objective

The University has established various Student Centric Club/Cells for the smooth functioning of co-curricular and extracurricular activities. The main Objective of this practice is the overall personality development of the students by encouraging them to participate in various activities.

# 5. Evidence of Success

• The enhancement in confidence levels of students is also apparent from the way they are able to communicate and perform their different duties/roles in more organized way.

- The students participate more enthusiastically in all co-curricular/extra-curricular activities including sports & games as now they are also the decision-makers for such events/activities.
- More students are coming forward for Inter-departmental or Inter-university competitions after the establishment of these clubs/cells.
- Initially the students and some teachers were bit-skeptical about this exercise, but now more number of student as-well-as teachers likes to be the part of these clubs/cells.

# 6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

Faculty of the University always motivate the students to participate in the activities organized under the various clubs but at times students don't participate even after giving their consent. The faculty members have to put really hard labour to motivate the students so that they should be present on the day of activity.
